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## **Section 1: Introduction**

At West Drayton Academy (WDA) we are committed to giving all of our children every opportunity to achieve the highest standards. We do this by taking account of pupils' varied life experiences and needs. We will offer a broad and balanced curriculum and have high expectations for all children. The achievements, attitudes and well-being of all our children matter. WDA promotes the individuality of all our children, irrespective of ethnicity, attainment, age, disability, gender or background.

WDA aims to be an inclusive academy. We actively seek to remove the barriers to learning and participation that can hinder or exclude individual pupils, or groups of pupils. This means that equality of opportunity must be a reality for our children.

The Equality Act 2010 replaced previous discrimination law and provides a single piece of legislation covering all the types of discrimination that are unlawful. WDA has a duty to carry out accessibility planning for disabled pupils.

Our academy's accessibility plan is aimed at:

- Increasing the extent to which disabled pupils can participate in the curriculum
- Improving the physical environment of schools to enable disabled pupils to take better advantage of education, benefits, facilities and services provided, and
- Improving the availability of accessible information to disabled pupils

We recognise the need to provide adequate resources for implementing plans and will regularly review them.

### **Definition of Disability**

The Equality Act 2010 defines disability as when a person has a 'physical or mental impairment which has a substantial and long term adverse effect on that person's ability to carry out normal day to day activities.'

## **Section 2: Key Objectives**

The academy recognises its duty under the Equality Act 2010 to not discriminate against a pupil or potential pupil by treating them less favourably than others.

The Accessibility Plan aims to ensure that:

- The academy draws on the expertise of external agencies to provide specialist advice and support.
- The Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENDCO) has an overview of the needs of disabled pupils.
- There are high expectations.

- There is appropriate deployment and training of learning support staff.
- Successful practice is shared within the academy.
- Disabled pupils have access to extended school provision.

The plan addresses improving access to:

- The physical environment;
- Education, facilities and services;
- Information usually provided in written form.
